is the journal of the Civic Trust. The autumn 2004 issue contains a short piece about the Brighton Society.


We have been sent a number of copies, so if you would like one, please get in touch and I will put one in the post to you.

Some time ago we - with representatives of Hove Civic Society, the Regency Society and the Kingscliff Society - all had a meeting with the chief executive of the Civic Trust about the the role they had awarded to the local developer Karis, the developer of the King Alfred site, the Endeavour Tower (the scheme has now been abandoned) the Banana Building in North Laine (now on hold) as an adviser on conservation and public participation.

We had requested that something about this meeting be included as one of our concerns and should be mentioned in the Civic Focus article. It has not.

The Brighton Society intends to write to the new replacement for the last Chief Executive to ask whether he intends that Karis should continue in this role.

We hope that the four societies mentioned above will also be signatories to this letter.
